(Number of words remembered) Experimental group: 6.90, Control group: 7.42. Conclusions/Discussion	
7% more words were remembered by the control group. We think the cluttered page caused interference with the experimental group's ability to memorize words. Our conclusion is that clutter confuses a person's ability to remember what they see and interferes with the ability to memorize.
