After letting the water run off to settle I measured the amount of soil at the bottom of each container.  The box with the plain soil consistently reached the highest levels of erosion of the five boxes. The reason why the sticks, straw, and rocks were so successful was because the water would hit the materials and spread out so it wouldn't hit in one spot which would cause the erosion to occur.  The reason why the plain dirt was so unsuccessful was because the dirt didn't have anything to protect it from the water and the dirt would just wash away.  I enjoyed learning about erosion and feel it is an important lesson. In our area where I live we receive a lot of rain fall and erosion is a real problem to the enviroment. The waters become muddy and create an unhealthy invironment for the fish.
