<p>Objective: As I was growing up a lot of things happened to me that I could not explain, things in my own home. My family told me incredible stories of unexplained things that had happened to them throughout their lives. I grew up surrounded by family stories, scary books, Hollywood and the news sharing their paranormal experiences, but even now I ask myself, "Do I believe it or not"? How does science explain paranormal activity? I wondered about my friends, neighbors, teachers and community. Did they believe in the paranormal? This encouraged me to ask the question; "Paranormal, does a society believe it or not?"</p> <p>Materials and Methods: As I began to open books, ask questions and search the Internet, I discovered that paranormal meant different things to different people. Paranormal didn't just mean ghosts, but ESP, dreams, near-death experiences, psychics, Ouija boards, faith experiences with Angels and Demons and many other experiences. After receiving feedback from people I had talked to, I decided the most scientific way to gather, record and report, was through a survey which asked many different questions on the paranormal. I also added a section which gave me some personal information on each person like sex, age and religious background.</p> <p>Results: Early in my research I wrote to the President and Founder of the Ghost/UFO/Alien Research Society. I told her about my project and asked her advice. She said to me, "Most people don't believe in ghosts, until they actually have an encounter with one. Seeing is Believing"> I based my survey and the results on that same idea. I present each question from the survey, add some research and then develop the answers with graphs, charts or percentages to show if society believes it or not.</p> <p>Conclusion: In my hypothesis I said that I thought people would say they did not believe because they would be embarrassed to talk about their experience. I have never really talked about my encounters because I thought people would think I was weird. I was wrong. Society believes and is not afraid to talk about it.
